



Visitor ID Badges Required During Restricted Visiting Hours

Ensuring safety for our patients,
their loved ones and each other

Duke University Hospital requires all guests to check in with hospital staff and wear a printed ID badge during the **restricted visitation hours of 9 p.m. – 6 a.m.**

Visitors to the Emergency Department will need to wear a badge **at all hours.**

Visitors will need to show a driver's license or a similar form of identification at check-in.

Getting an ID badge

Visitors entering the hospital during the restricted visitation hours of 9 p.m. – 6 a.m. will need to check in at one of the following main entry locations:

- The Duke University Hospital lobby
- The tunnel walkway from Parking Garage II
- The Emergency Department front desk
- The Duke Medicine Pavilion front desk

Visitors that entered the building before restricted visitation hours and are staying in a patient's room overnight can receive a temporary badge from the unit's health unit coordinator at the front desk of the unit they are visiting.

Visitors staying at the hospital for more than seven consecutive days can receive a badge from one of the main entry locations that will remain valid during the length of their stay. These visitors need to talk with the unit charge nurse to get a form to take to the check-in location to receive their badge.

All visitors will need to show a driver's license or a similar form of identification at check-in.
