

Principles of Community Engagement

- 1. Proposed projects should be based on a need identified by Duke and the community is beneficial to the community.
- 2. Scope and time-frame of project should be clear to the community. Partners must be willing to commit time and resources to the project.
- 3. Partners must trust each other and build mutual respect while learning from each other's perspectives.
- 4. A diverse range of community members and agencies need to participate to ensure that proposed activities meet the needs of a diverse population.
- 5. A safe environment must exist for all participants of all backgrounds to share ideas with out fear of ridicule or criticism. No blaming or judgments. Keep lines of communication open.
- 6. Partners must be good stewards of project data and include the community in outcome reporting and evaluation, potential programmatic intervention, education, opportunities, and future program planning activities.
